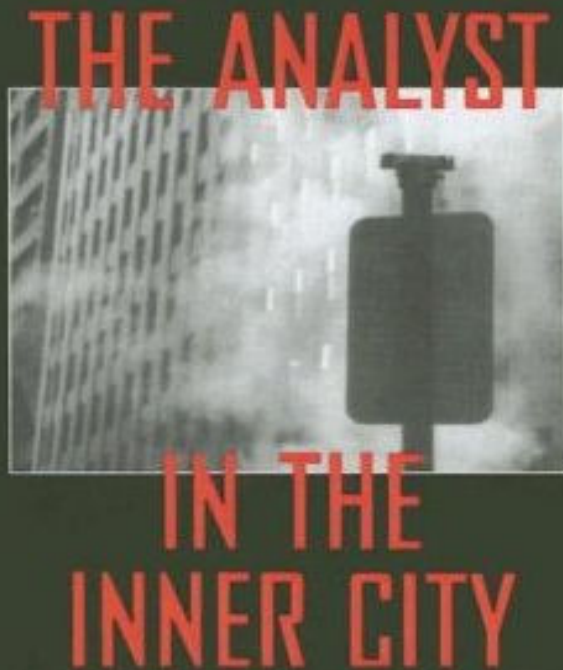

Neil Altman, Ph.D., is an Associate Clinical Professor in the Post-Doctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis at New York University, and co-editor of *Psychoanalytic Dialogues: A Journal of Relational Perspectives*. He is author of **The Analyst in the Inner City: Race, Class, and Culture through a Psychoanalytic Lens** and co-author of **Relational Child Psychotherapy**. Dr. Altman is Past President of the Section on Social Responsibility of Division 39 of the American Psychological Association and serves on the Board of the International Association of Relational Psychoanalysis & Psychotherapy. He is a founding board member, consultation group leader, and therapist in Fostering Connection, a program that offers pro bono psychotherapy to foster children.

While Dr. Neil Altman was in psychoanalytic training, he worked at an inner-city public clinic in New York City's South Bronx. As a result of this work, Dr. Altman began thinking and writing about how psychoanalysis could be made more inclusive for racial minorities and lower-income individuals.
