Your role: *Under the supervision of the Program Director, the Clinical Supervisor provides clinical supervision and oversees/monitors the quality of care provided by supervisees at the RAMS Fu Yau Project, which is a program providing childcare consultation services at over 30 sites throughout San Francisco.*

Minimum Required Qualifications:

1. Doctorate and/or Masters degree in Psychology, Marriage & Family Therapy, Counseling, Social Work, or other related disciplines from an accredited institution
2. Valid clinical licensure in California (i.e., Psychologist, LCSW, MFT, LPCC) and able to meet State/Board requirements to serve as a clinical supervisor, i.e. completion of approved Clinical Supervisor Training Course, and licensure of at least 2 years
3. At least two years of experience providing clinical supervision as a licensed supervisor.
4. At least five years of experience post-licensure providing behavioral health services in a community behavioral health/ child-care-based, or school based setting
5. Knowledge of healthy child development, required
6. Experience working with young children and their families, required. Experience working with immigrant children 0-5 years old and their families, preferred
7. Demonstrated experience and thorough knowledge of working with various populations with different income levels, ethnicities, and languages (this position works specifically with immigrant & minority children & their families, most of whom are of low socioeconomic status)

Other Preferred Qualifications:

8. Understanding of the childcare culture & community
9. Experience in child care settings, both center-based and family child care, preferred
10. Experience in mental health consultation, preferred

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Essential Job Duties include, but are not limited to:

1. Provide clinical supervision, oversee & monitor quality of care provided by supervisees (e.g. service delivery, documentation, etc) ensuring quality assurance, and providing crisis intervention consultation as needed
2. Ensure that supervisees comply with all licensing Board regulations, guidelines, and state requirements
3. Lead clinical group meetings with Mental Health Consultant staff
4. Train mental health consultants on clinical issues, including but not limited to, child development, young children's mental health, community violence, cultural competence, clinical issues as related to providing case and program consultation and clinical services at child care provider sites.
5. Provide, facilitate, &/or participate in clinical training & education, case conferences, in-service trainings, and educational & training workshops to/for staff, trainees, &/or interns, or community, as requested
6. Monitor Fu Yau Project's mental health consultants' clinical documentations; co-sign documents as needed.
7. Promote high clinical standards of care
8. Attend program staff meetings, trainings, &/or events as requested/instructed, including those at Chinatown Child Development Center &/or other locations
9. Collaborate with Program Director and agency staff at Chinatown Child Development Center.
10. As needed, participate in the clinical leadership team at Fu Yau Project with Program Director & other clinical supervisor(s), in assessing & planning for clinical services & administrative needs
11. Perform other related tasks & duties as assigned
