Richmond Area Multi-Services (RAMS) is currently searching for a
Mental Health Consultant
for the **RAMS Fu Yau Project**

TWO positions available: 1st) Bilingual fluency in Cantonese or Cantonese/Mandarin REQUIRED, and 2nd) Bilingual fluency in Spanish, Cantonese, or Mandarin HIGHLY PREFERRED, due to needs of the populations being served by this program.

Fu Yau Project is a collaboration of Richmond Area Multi-Services, Inc. (RAMS) and Department of Public Health, Community Behavioral Health, Children Youth and Families Section, Chinatown Child Development Center (CCDC). The Fu Yau Project is a program that provides mental health consultation services to the childcare community serving children 0-5 years old and their families in San Francisco. The program strives to provide linguistic, cultural and clinical competent mental health services to the high need and underserved communities in San Francisco – limited and non-English speaking, low socioeconomic, immigrant and refugee families, and families who are exposed to violence and discrimination.

Salary Range: \$41,000 - \$47,000 depending on experience & qualifications

Status: Part to Full-Time (20 to 40 hr/wk)

Benefits: Health insurance coverage + leave benefits

Essential Job Duties include, but are not limited to:

1. Provide Mental Health consultation to child care personnel, and program and case consultation at child care centers &/or family child care homes.
2. Provide on-site mental health services to children from 0-5 years old individually, to their families, and in groups.
3. Provide on-site parenting classes &/or support groups to the families with children 0-5.
4. Provide on-site in-service training to child care personnel on mental health related topics.
5. Provide appropriate referrals and case management as needed.
6. Attend required staff meetings, group and individual supervision meetings, in-service meetings, trainings, and community meetings as requested by the project coordinator &/or program director.
7. Provide other mental health services to children and families as part of the continuum of care.
8. Other duties as assigned.

Additional Job Info:

1. Some evening and weekends may be required.
2. On-site services may require traveling within the city of San Francisco via public transportation &/or driving own vehicle.

Required Educational level or Equivalent Experience:

1. At least Masters Degree or higher in Psychology, Social Work, Counseling, or other related disciplines, required.
2. Knowledge of healthy child development, required.
3. Experience working with young children and their families.
4. Experience working with immigrant children 0-5 years old and their families, preferred.
5. Experience in child care settings, both center-based and family child care, highly recommended.
6. Experience in mental health consultation helpful.

4. Familiarity with the San Francisco community resources/services (may include health, mental health, substance abuse, vocational, housing, etc), highly preferred.
5. Strong commitment to the philosophy, goals, & mission of RAMS in providing community-based, culturally competent, and consumer-guided mental health services to the community.
6. Commitment to engaging in professional development activities such as trainings, continuing education seminars, case conferences, and reviewing up-to-date material, etc., as related to treatment strategies for the population of Fu Yau.
7. Strong interpersonal skills and ability to work effectively and interact professionally with a diverse, multi-cultural, and interdisciplinary staff of all levels.
8. Ability to work and function independently, and as a team player of the Fu Yau project, and with the child care site assigned.
