Richmond Village Beacon (RVB) is operated by Richmond District Neighborhood Center serving over 200 children at 2 San Francisco Unified School District middle schools located in the Richmond District. RVB has always believed in serving the whole child in this innovative Beacon Center which include academic support, recreational activities, enrichment programs, and mental health services.

**Salary Range:** \$20,500 - \$23,000 (for half-time), DEPENDING ON EXPERIENCE/QUALIFICATIONS

**Hours/wk:** 20 hours per week, at least 4 afternoons per week + other flex/available

## **Essential Job Duties include, but are not limited to:**

1. Observation and clinical screening of students at the Richmond Village Beacon Centers located at two middle schools.
2. Consultation to the Village Beacon staff on mental health issues of the program and participants.
3. Consultation to the families and referrals to mental health related services as needed.
4. Provide in-service training to the program staff on mental health related topics as needed.
5. Provide parenting workshops to participating families as requested.
6. Collaborate with other educational/ service providers in coordinating mental health services for program students as needed.
7. Participate in ongoing clinical in-service training offered by RAMS and/or CBHS on topics related to work area as needed or requested by Director of CYF.
8. Receive clinical supervision regularly.
9. Perform other duties as assigned.

## **Educational level or Equivalent Experience:**

1. At least a Master's degree (or equivalent) in Psychology, Marriage & Family Therapy, Social Work, Counseling, or Child Development from an accredited university. Board Registration highly preferred, but not required.
2. At least one year experience working with children and families.
3. Experience working with immigrant families and in educational/group care environment preferred.

## **Other Requirements:**

1. Understanding of normal childhood and adolescent development
2. Understanding of childhood and adolescent psychopathology
3. Ability to work in an educational/recreational environment, at multiple sites and with their personnel
4. Ability to interface with educators, community-based organizations, and parents.
5. Travel to different sites within the Richmond District.
6. Strong commitment to the philosophy, goals, & mission of RAMS, including providing clinically culturally competent mental health services in a community setting.
7. A commitment to engage in professional development through attending trainings, continuing education seminars, case conferences, and reading new material, etc., as related to treatment and support services for those with co-occurring disorders/dual diagnosis
8. Strong interpersonal skills and ability to work effectively, function independently, and interact professionally with a diverse, multi-cultural, and interdisciplinary staff of all levels
9. Applicants with ability to provide bilingual & culturally competent services in Cantonese **HIGHLY PREFERRED** due to the nature of the populations served by this position.
