

RAMS Peer Specialist Mental Health Certificate Advanced Course

Interactive Classes

Classes will be conducted by experts working and teaching in the behavioral health field, as well as peer practitioners who have years of experience serving the San Francisco community. Students will have regular opportunities to practice the skills and techniques learned in class through interactive exercises with classmates and instructors.



Specialized Training

Students will be trained in topics relevant to the peer counseling field, such as: Counseling Interventions, Goal Setting and Care Planning, Cultural Competence, Boundaries and Ethics, Client and Community Advocacy, Peer Supervision and Mentoring, Documentation, Self-Care, and more!

In June 2016, Richmond Area Multi-Services Inc. (RAMS), will offer its **8-week Peer Specialist Mental Health Certificate Advanced Course** to current or former mental health consumers and family members residing in San Francisco, with the aim of reaching the underserved and underrepresented San Francisco communities.

The Advanced Course is designed to support and educate people who have experience providing peer services and/or have participated in volunteer and advocacy work in the behavioral health field, and would like to obtain specialized peer counseling training, professional development and networking opportunities. Through the class, students will expand their knowledge and build confidence and skills in providing quality peer specialist support and counseling services in the community.

Summer 2016 Course Details

The Advanced Course will take place from **June 14, 2016 to August 4, 2016**.

Classes will be held Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3PM to 6PM at SF State Downtown Campus (835 Market St). The course is free of cost to students.
