## **TOPIC: BOUNDARIES & ETHICAL PRACTICE FOR PEERS**

**About the training:** Working in the behavioral health services field can be challenging, and it is essential for us to have a holistic understanding of professional boundaries and ethical practice to guide us as we work with individuals and groups in the community. In this interactive training, we will examine what professional boundaries and ethical practice mean for peer providers, review the concepts of multiple roles and responsibilities, and engage in dialogue around multicultural and social justice perspectives on boundaries. Participants will also get to explore the roles emotional regulation and self-awareness play in ethical decision-making, and learn about helpful guidelines and recommendations for managing boundaries in our work.

**About the Instructor:** Edith Guillén-Núñez, JD, LMFT is an attorney, licensed marriage and family therapist and Associate Director of the Community Mental Health Certificate program at City College of San Francisco.
