

RAMS, Inc. (Richmond Area Multi-Services) is a private, non-profit mental health agency that is committed to advocating for and providing community based, culturally-competent, and consumer-guided comprehensive services, with an emphasis on serving Asian & Pacific Islander Americans. Founded in San Francisco's Richmond District in 1974, our agency offers comprehensive services that aim to meet the behavioral health, social, vocational, and educational needs of the diverse community of the San Francisco Area with special focus on the Asian & Pacific Islander American and Russian-speaking populations.

Each year, RAMS serves about 15,000 adults, children, youth, and families and provides services in over 30 languages, including Asian dialects – Cambodian, Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Korean, Lao, Punjabi, Tagalog, Thai, and Vietnamese – Spanish and Russian. RAMS fosters leadership in and efforts towards raising awareness and reducing the stigma of mental health. Such activities include: sponsor health fairs, public policy advocacy, facilitate community workshops, establish & participate in coalitions, and participate in media campaigns.
